Annual Report to the Community



The Vulcan County Health and Wellness Foundation (VCHWF) is a charitable organization which began in 2011, and currently has 13 volunteer Trustees and 3 part time Personnel.

The Foundation exists:

· To provide the resources to support and ensure viability and sustainability of the Vulcan Community Health Centre. Every dollar donated to the Foundation stays in Vulcan County and will be used to provide the highest quality of health care possible to all citizens living in the County.

- To develop, promote, and deliver health and wellness programs that service all citizens living in Vulcan County.
- To provide bursaries for the professional healthcare workers in our community allowing them to continue their education and/or take courses in specialized areas.

The Foundation has been fundraising for an expansion at the Vulcan Community Health Center. This space includes a new medical clinic. adult day support and rehabilitation services, and a Wellness Center, where residents can become more aware of health issues and prevention. A

library of resources, prevention and wellness programming using both in - house instructors and technology, kitchen space and recreational activities will all lead to more knowledgeable clients as they become stewards for their own health, all on a green footprint. The Expansion will free space in the existing facility, allowing other services, such as the lab and palliative care, to expand in the future. The plan can be seen at the Foundation office.

Through the generous support of its donors and partners, the Foundation has raised more per capita than any of the 69 other Foundations in the Province to date. We have raised approximately 1.1 million dollars, and through the support of the Town of Vulcan and Vulcan County, who match these donations, this amount is tripled. We have approximately 3.3 million dollars dedicated to this project. Our goal is \$4.5 million dollars. The expansion is a great start on a 30-year plan for Health and Wellness in the County.

A Memorandum of Understanding between Alberta Health Services and the Vulcan County Health and Wellness Foundation has been signed. This agreement has moved us into the



Construction Phase of the Health Centre Expansion representing 800 sq.m. of new space, with ground breaking set for the spring of 2018 and completion targeted for 2019.

Why do we believe the Vulcan Community Health Center is important to our community? Our residents rely on local health care, and the Health Center is an asset when people consider settling in a rural community. We believe that a larger space which encourages innovation and use of technology will support the vision of bringing more medical personnel, as well as encouraging opportunity for rural research, possible. The Community Health Centre is one of the largest employers in Vulcan County with over 130 employees and many regular volunteers.

We hope that all residents, and those that have family members who use the facility, will see the value in our projects, both now and in the future, and financially support our endeavours. We are a charitable organization and can issue tax receipts. We have a recognition policy which recognizes cumulative contributions over time.

Our Heart is in Health Care, Wellness and Innovation.
