This past year, we fulfilled a promise made during the expansion of the Vulcan Community Health Centre—to use that space to promote health education, information sharing, and community wellness through meaningful programming. The result has been a year filled with purpose, growth, and impact.

Wellness Programming Comes to Life

Through your support, the Foundation has been able to bring programming directly into the Wellness Space at the Vulcan Community Health Centre.

- **Wellness Wednesdays, Mom & Baby Wellness, and Resiliency Circles** have provided trusted, accessible opportunities for learning, connection, and support.
- Together with partners such as **Market Street Pharmacy, Vulcan FCSS, and New Heights Wellness**, we have delivered sessions focused on nutrition, mental health, physical activity, and aging well.
- Our **Love Letter to Men** conference and **First Responders Workshop** encouraged open dialogue around mental health and built a culture of care and resilience.

These initiatives are the very essence of what our community envisioned when we built the expansion—to make wellness education and prevention part of everyday life in Vulcan County.

Palliative Care Suite Renewal

The major focus of our 2025 fundraising efforts has been supporting the **Vulcan Community Health Centre's Palliative Care Committee** and their vision to modernize and humanize our Palliative Care Suite.

Thanks to your compassion and commitment, they are already **one-third of the way to their fundraising goal**.

Through community events like the **24-Hour Golf Challenge** and the **VCHWF Charity Golf Classic**, along with generous contributions from local businesses, service clubs, and families, we have raised over **\$108,000** toward this transformation.

The updated suite will feature a cuddle bed, roll-in shower, ceiling lift, and direct access to the garden—creating a peaceful, home-like environment for patients and families to share meaningful moments together.

A Year of Community Collaboration

Your support has allowed us to continue vital partnerships:

- With the **University of Alberta Rehabilitation Robotics Lab** and **Recovery Alberta**, expanding access to specialized rural programming.
- Through **Act4Health**, supporting the **Social Prescribing Link Worker Program**—a community-based model connecting residents to local supports that impact overall well-being.
- With **County Central High School, Vulcan Elks, and Vulcan 4-H**, we are empowering youth and service groups to invest in the health of future generations.
