About the Challenge

The **24-Hour Golf Challenge** is a signature endurance fundraising event supporting the **Vulcan County Health and Wellness Foundation (VCHWF)**. Running simultaneously with the Charity Golf Classic, this challenge brings together dedicated supporters who commit to playing golf for a full 24 hours while raising funds to support local health and wellness initiatives across Vulcan County.

Participation is limited, creating a unique, high-impact experience rooted in camaraderie, resilience, and community pride.

Did we mention fun? It's a ton of fun!

Event Schedule & Flow

Friday, June 19 – Kick-Off Day

9:00 AM – Welcome & Player Introductions

- Introduction of 24-Hour Challenge players
- Official send-off onto the course

10:00 AM – Charity Golf Classic Shotgun Start

- The tournament begins immediately behind the 24-Hour Challenge players
- Challenge players may play through tournament groups throughout the day

Throughout the Day & Night

- Players compete in teams of four
- Food and non- alcoholic beverages are available all day and overnight
- Dedicated volunteer team supports players
- Dinner service features a prime rib meal
- Team in the lead (or as agreed) is served first

Night Play

- Glow balls are used for night golf
- Score does not matter – fun and endurance are the focus
- As long as four players are on the course (two from each team), play may continue
- Others may rest in the clubhouse

Weather Contingency:

In cases of severe weather, a shortened loop near the clubhouse may be used. Player safety is always the priority. Indoor amenities may include: - Golf simulator - Games and crib boards - Warm rest areas

Saturday, June 20 – Finish Line

- 9:00 AM – Final hole played
- Players are welcomed on Hole #9 by the Ladies' 2-Ball Tournament

Mandatory Safety Requirement:

All players must have a designated ride home on Saturday morning. Sleep deprivation is real, and the community is busy with the Tin Man Mini Triathlon. This requirement is strictly enforced.

Player Commitment Agreement

This Player Commitment Agreement outlines the expectations, responsibilities, and standards for individuals participating in the **24-Hour Golf Challenge** in support of the Vulcan County Health and Wellness Foundation (VCHWF).

1. Commitment to Participation

By confirming participation, the player agrees to: - Commit to the full **24-hour duration** of the challenge, from Friday morning through Saturday morning - Participate as a member of a **team of four**, supporting fellow players throughout the challenge - Communicate proactively with event organizers if issues arise that may affect participation

2. Conduct & Representation

Players acknowledge that they are ambassadors for the Vulcan County Health and Wellness Foundation and agree to: - Conduct themselves in a respectful, sportsmanlike, and community-minded manner at all times - Be mindful that the Vulcan Golf and Country Club is a **public community course** - Follow all course rules and instructions from course staff and volunteers - Treat volunteers, fellow players, staff, and community members with courtesy and appreciation

3. Alcohol & Substance Use

Players agree that: - Alcohol consumption, if any, will be **kept to a reasonable and responsible level** - Intoxication or unsafe behaviour will not be tolerated - Event organizers reserve the right to intervene if alcohol consumption becomes unsafe or inappropriate

4. Safety & Well-Being

Player safety is the top priority. By participating, players agree to: - Dress appropriately for changing weather conditions - Take rest breaks as needed and monitor personal health throughout the challenge - Follow all safety adaptations made due to weather or course conditions - **Arrange a designated ride home** for the morning of Saturday, June 20

Players acknowledge that **sleep deprivation poses a real safety risk and agree not to drive after completing** the challenge.

5. Weather & Event Adaptability

Players understand that: - The challenge will proceed rain or shine, with safety-based adjustments as required - Severe weather may result in modified play, shortened loops, or temporary indoor activities - Event organizers' decisions regarding safety and play format are final

6. Fundraising Commitment

Players agree to: - Actively participate in fundraising efforts beginning May 1 - Provide required marketing materials, including: - High-resolution headshot - Short bio - Personal statement explaining their reason for fundraising - Share their personalized donation link within their personal and professional networks

Players understand that: - All donations are made directly to VCHWF - Donors will receive official tax receipts issued by the Foundation - Weekly donation reports will be provided for stewardship and personal thank-you purposes





7. Media & Promotion Consent

Players grant permission to: - Be photographed or recorded during the event - Have their name, image, and story used in VCHWF promotional materials, including social media, email campaigns, and website content This consent is provided without expectation of compensation.

8. Assumption of Risk & Waiver

Players acknowledge that participation in the 24-Hour Golf Challenge involves physical exertion and inherent risks, including fatigue, injury, and weather-related conditions.

By participating, players: - Voluntarily assume all risks associated with the challenge - Release and hold harmless the Vulcan County Health and Wellness Foundation, event volunteers, and Vulcan Golf and Country Club from liability to the extent permitted by law
